



### **Home Assessment and Cost of Future Care:**

It has been arranged for an Occupational Therapist to meet you at your residence. Your address and contact number has been provided by your law firm.

The purpose of the interview and assessment is for the Occupational Therapist to gain a better understanding of your present situation, abilities and limitations. This will allow the therapist to provide comments, recommendations for services and/or assistive devices that you may require on an ongoing basis.

The assessment takes place over a period of 90 minutes to 3 or 4 hours depending on your situation. The Home Assessment will include the following:

Interview - You and the Occupational Therapist will be sitting down to discuss the accident, the therapies you have had, your pre-accident and present work, your living situation and other ongoing problems you are having as a result of the accident(s).

Questionnaires: The Occupational Therapist will ask you to fill out some questionnaires based on your abilities and restrictions;

Musculoskeletal Testing: The therapist will assess your joint flexibility and strength, any other structural problems that you have ongoing and your movement patterns.

Functional Testing: The Occupational Therapist may be requesting that you perform certain activities at home to gain an idea of your current level of functioning in your household environment.

Level of Effort: It is important that you provide a good and consistent level of effort during the testing so that the Occupational Therapist has a better understanding of your abilities and limitations.
